As I look back over the past season, my heart is filled with gratitude. God has been faithful, and He continues to guide our church in exciting ways. It is such a joy to see that as our church family grows, the Lord is providing gifted servants to meet the needs of an expanding ministry. This fall, I am encouraged to see new members stepping into roles on our Board, Ministry Committees, and with our Ministry Staff. Truly, God is raising up workers for His harvest field here at Banwell.

As I envision the 2025-2026 ministry year, I am eager to share some new developments with you. This fall will begin with a 10-part sermon series on Spiritual Warfare, where I will take us on a deeper look at the Full Armour of God and how we are called to use it in our daily walk with Christ. This series will combine biblical teaching with practical instruction on how we can claim new ground—in our personal lives, our families, our church, and our community—for the Kingdom of God.

As we step into the new year, I am excited to lead our congregation on a journey through the entire Bible. Each day in 2026 we will follow a chronological Bible reading plan, allowing us as a church to literally be on the same page. Each week's sermon and small group resources will be connected to the readings, helping us dig deeper and grow together. Many of us desire to spend more time in God's Word and to understand it more fully. This journey will give us a meaningful opportunity to do just that—building a shared love for God and His Word as we walk through Scripture side by side.

This past month has also been a joy as Pastor James officially began his ministry with us in August. Together we have been praying and planning for the future, exploring ways to expand our discipleship ministry. Our desire is that every person at Banwell would be intentionally connected with others for spiritual growth in small groups and intentional discipleship opportunities.

We are also prayerfully seeking to expand our pastoral team with additional shepherds who will help address the spiritual needs of our growing congregation. It has long been on my heart to see the shepherding leadership of our church grow in strength and depth, with God's Word shaping our every step.

Alongside this, our staff and committees will be working to create new opportunities for volunteers to use their gifts in ministry. As we find our stride this fall, we want to help every member of our church family discover the joy of serving in ways that build up the Body of Christ.

Finally, I am happy to share that this October I will be part of a small team travelling to Guatemala on a Visioning Trip to explore a partnership with Pastor Juan Peliz. I will be joining Mario and Miriam Tricarico from our Banwell family, along with Mark and Dawn Sterken from ABWE. Together we will be prayerfully exploring how Banwell, ABWE, and New Generation Ministries can work together in the Gospel. I look forward to sharing more in the months ahead as we seek God's direction for this exciting opportunity.

What I see in all of these things—new servants stepping up, new ministry opportunities, new partnerships forming—is God's faithfulness at work. May we continue to walk forward together in faith, keeping our eyes on Him as He leads us into the future.

The purpose of this trip is to survey and learn more about the 'New Generation Church' ministry of Pastor Juan Peliz, who has faithfully been labouring to plant new churches and reach Mayan communities, in Guatemala, with the hope of Christ. Our team will spend time with Pastor Juan and his congregation, building relationships, learning about the needs of the region, and exploring how our church can come alongside them in their work. This survey trip is not only about seeing the ministry firsthand, but also about prayerfully discerning how God might call our congregation to play a greater role in supporting church planting in Guatemala. By sending this team, we are taking an important step toward future partnerships and opportunities to join in what God is doing among His people there.

As a committee, our mission is to promote varied opportunities for outreach and global missions so that the whole congregation can participate—whether by going, giving, or praying. Consequently, the board has approved the taking of a special offering during our September 7,2025 church service in support of this trip. We believe this trip will open doors for deeper involvement and allow us to strengthen our connection to the worldwide body of Christ.

We ask you to join us in prayer for the three team members traveling, for Pastor Juan and his ministry, and for God's direction as we explore how our church can continue to plant seeds of the Gospel in Guatemala. May this trip inspire all of us to consider how we can be part of God's mission both near and far.

Youth Group Update

Although our youth took most of the summer off, they gathered at the Thwaites' home in late July for a BBQ filled with fellowship and fun. I'm deeply grateful for the ways Jay and Carrie have stepped up to invest in our young people. Their faithful commitment has nurtured individual souls and helped cultivate a healthy, vibrant community here at Banwell Community Church.

I'm excited to re-launch our Youth Group on Friday, September 19th, from 6:30–8:30 PM, open to students in grades 6–12. My hope is to help raise a generation that loves and reveres the Word of God—students who recognize its authority and come to cherish its life-giving wisdom.

To that end, we'll be diving into a weekly study of the book of James, a powerful source of practical guidance for godly living. Each evening will begin with a brief teaching, followed by small group discussions to engage more deeply with the text, and time set aside for prayer and reflection.

Of course, a Youth Group wouldn't be complete without icebreaker games to help students connect. We'll also incorporate worship music to set the tone where appropriate, and make space for snacks, games, and fellowship throughout the year.

While the book of James will be our anchor, we'll occasionally pause to explore seasonal themes—like gratitude around Thanksgiving or a gospel-centered message as we approach Christmas. Looking ahead, we're dreaming about service projects and retreats that may take shape in the spring or summer. Stay tuned for the adventures that await our young people!

My request to you, Church, is simple: please be in prayer for us. Pray that our minds, emotions, and actions would be shaped by the Word and led by the Spirit—for our growth and for His glory. He is the Good Shepherd. He is the One who makes us to become fishers of men. May we rely on His strength and leadership in all that we do.

A heartfelt thank you to Aaron Blata for re-launching our Young Adults Group at the start of the summer. This will be a particularly intentional season to uncover the gifts God has placed within us—and to use them for the flourishing of the wider church and our own spiritual growth.

VACATION BIBLE SCHOOL - July 2025

This summer has been very exciting at Banwell Community Church regarding our children's ministry. The summer students and I have been hard at work getting our summer camp ready, planning the midweek drop in, as well as getting things organized and cleaned up in rooms 4 and 5. A huge thank you to Malina Klassen and Joel Preston for all of their hard work and dedication to our children's ministries. The summer couldn't have run as smoothly as it did without the two of them helping us out in such a big way. We pray for God's blessing over them as they start a new adventure in the fall at University of Windsor.

True North Summer Camp

This summer we also worked on getting ready for and running our "True North" kids summer camp or Vacation Bible School (VBS). And it was a huge success! We saw enrollment of 75 children with an average of about 70–72 children attending each day. This is about 3 times bigger than the previous years that we have run VBS. The change from the evening to the daytime time was a huge success. Not only that, but this is the first year we saw a great response from our community interacting with our VBS as well. 40 of the 75 children were from our own church community, but 30 of the children were neighborhood kids, who are not connected with a church. Each day the kids sang exciting worship songs, played energetic games in the gym, created crafts and did fun experiments. Each day we focused their attention on how Jesus is their "true north" and worthy of their trust. On Thursday we had a time where the children were given the opportunity to accept Jesus into their hearts, and many children received Jesus as their "forever friend". On a side note, the church also looked incredible with all the decorations that were put up for that week. The bonus for the whole congregation was, if you didn't get away to the cottage this summer, for one week the church made you feel as though you were up north sitting by the lake!

We had about 30 volunteers who were willing to show up each day and make this week a huge success. Whether it was leading a large group session, or being a small group leader, making food, signing kids in, or helping with clean up each night, we couldn't have run such an amazing program without all these people. We also had an amazing decorating crew that were here for countless hours the week before and then again after VBS was over getting the church "back to normal". We are so blessed to have so many people willing to give of their time, talent and treasure towards making our VBS a stunning success.

Weekly Summer Drop In

As mentioned above, we started a new mid-week Summer Drop In for families that took place each Wednesday from 9:30am-11:00am in our Community Outreach Centre. Each week Joel Preston came up with fun games for the kids to play in the gym and Malina Klassen worked on a new creative craft. Kids could spend time hanging out with their friends and having fun while parents were able to have some much needed "grown up time" with other parents. Each week we saw about 25-30 kids show up.

Clean up of the church

Finally, if you walk down our children's ministry wing, you can see that rooms 4 and 5 have been completely cleaned out. This is mostly due to Malina and Joel working throughout the summer to reorganize those rooms and find places for all the items that were located there. We look forward to using these rooms again in the fall/winter for our children's ministry Sunday morning classes.

As we look forward to the fall, I want to draw your attention to a few things:

Kingdom Kids

Firstly, Kingdom kids will be launching on September 18, 2025, at 6:30-7:45. This program is for kids from grade 1 to grade 5. Each night we spend time learning from God's Word as well as having fun in the gym, playing games and hanging out with friends. Sunday School

Finally, the fall season of Sunday school is starting up. We have begun looking at new curriculum for our whole children's ministry. We hope to have that finalized by September 15, 2025. Stay tuned as we will be announcing soon details about what we have chosen. As our numbers in our Sunday school continue to grow, we have begun looking at the possibility of launching a new class later in the fall or in the winter season. We are hoping to get another class added to our already existing classes of Nursery, little lambs, early education and middle education. If you are willing to help teach that new class, please speak to Heather Amorin or Christa Braccio.

As always, please continue to pray for all our kids' ministries here at Banwell Community Church. We are not just "babysitting" but imparting Godly wisdom to the church of the future. Pray that hearts will be receptive to the words spoken by our loving teachers and that kids will continue to grow in their walk with Christ and/or accepting Jesus into their hearts for the very first time.

Finance Committee:

With everything that the Finance Committee has going on, our goals always remain the same, and that is to use the Lord's resources wisely and all for His glory. There are many reasons to be excited for what God has in store for Banwell and we pray that he can use us and this church to grow His Kingdom. God has blessed Banwell with so much and for that we are grateful..

As of the end of June, our Home Church Giving's are on track to our planned Budget year to date, and, expenses are coming in much lower and therefore, for the first 6 months, we are in an overall positive position of \$60,000 for our budget.

The Outreach Centre has now come to completion, and a decision was made to defer the installation of an elevator in the Outreach Centre until we can successfully apply for a grant. Therefore, this has left a healthy cash balance, and a decision has been made to repay \$150,000 on our mortgage. This repayment will take place August 28th, and we will then receive an updated amortization schedule. We expect that our 2025 year end balance for the mortgage will be around \$575,000.

The Finance Committee has also made decisions to increase our Contingency fund by \$50,000 and the balance now sits at \$150,000. Along with this, the Committee established two short term GICs and invested \$100,000.

During the September and October time frame, the Finance Committee will be preparing a 5-year financial plan (with inputs from other Committees) so that we can have a longer term picture of our financial situation and so that we continue to be good stewards of our Tithes and Offerings. At the same time, we will also be collaborating with all Committees to start the 2026 budget planning process.

We were fortunate enough to have Danielle Gadoury and Jeff MacKenzie accept positions on the Finance Committee. Danielle is our new Envelope Steward and is now getting caught up with responsibilities for this position. At the same time, as Maja Siracki and Bruce Rand leave our Committee, we sincerely thank them for their service, and, I would like to also acknowledge the dedicated work conducted by our continuing members of the Finance Committee. It is greatly appreciated.


